# STUDENT VISA ASSESSMENT LEVEL 2 APPLICATION CHECKLIST

The visa application checklist helps you check that you have included all of the necessary documentation that is needed by the department to process your visa application.

### How to use this checklist

- Before you sign your visa application form, use this checklist to ensure that you have included all necessary documentation to support your claims.
- 2. When you are satisfied that you have correctly completed your visa application form and all of the necessary documentation is included, you should sign and date your visa application form.
- 3. Include this completed checklist when you lodge your visa application form and necessary documentation.

### Important information

Please be aware that the decision on your visa application may be decided on the information and documentation that you include at the time of lodgement.

## **Delivery and courier charges**

You are responsible for all costs of delivering information to the Post by mail or courier, including any additional information that may be requested by the Post. If you give additional information to the Australian Visa Application Centre, you may be charged a courier fee for delivery to the Post.

The Visa Application Charge will not be refunded if a decision is made to refuse to grant the visa because the applicant did not satisfy the criteria for grant of the visa.

Do not provide original documents unless requested. You should provide certified copies of original documentation. Documents not in English must be accompanied by accredited English translations.

<b>Two recent passport-sized photographs</b> , no more than 6 months old, of you and any dependent included in the application.		
Print the name of the person on the back of each photograph.		
<b>Certified copies of passport or travel documents</b> (new and old showing any previous travels or visa grants) of all people included in the application.		
Passports must not have expired. If you are asked to attend a DIAC Office you must bring your passport.		
Secondary applicants – Necessary Requirements		
You will need to list details of all members of your family unit on the application form whether they intend to travel with you or not. A <b>member of your family unit is your spouse or your unmarried</b>		

dependent child who is under the age of 18. You should include evidence of your relationship e.g. marriage certificate and birth certificate for all dependents travelling with you.	
(If you are married/with or without children)  Certified evidence of the relationship between the applicant and all members of their family unit (spouse and children only), including those who are not joining the applicant in Australia. For example, family registration, marriage certificate, birth certificate of child, adoption certificate of a child, evidence of custody of child.	
(If you are in a de facto relationship)  Certified evidence of de facto relationship. For example: evidence of the applicant and de facto partner residing together, joint bank accounts, joint billing accounts.	
The <b>electronic Confirmation of Enrolment (eCOE) certificate(s)</b> issued by your education provider for the course(s) you are undertaking.	
Evidence of <b>Overseas Health Cover</b> for you and each person included in your application.	
Financial requirement – Necessary Requirements	
You will need to provide evidence of funds to cover the minimum financial requirements for the first year of your course. If your course is less than one year in duration, you will only need to provide evidence of funds for the duration of your course. Financial declaration part of the application form must be signed.  The required funds for student can be obtained from the internet.  Example:  For Higher Education subclass 573 see: <a href="http://www.immi.gov.au/students/students/573-2/financial.htm">http://www.immi.gov.au/students/students/573-2/financial.htm</a> For other subclasses, replace "573" with the relevant subclass.  Note: All members of the family unit should be declared and assessed for living costs and school fees, whether or not they are accompanying you.	
<ul> <li>You must provide evidence of funds to support you and your family members.</li> <li>Please note: The total funds must be sufficient to cover the first year of your course.</li> <li>Evidence of funds can include:</li> <li>a money deposit with a financial institution held by you or any individual willing to provide financial support to you; or</li> <li>a loan from a financial institution made to you or any individual willing to provide financial support to you or the government of your home country; or</li> <li>financial support from: your proposed education provider; the Commonwealth of Australia or an Australian State or Territory government; the government of a foreign country; a provincial or state government of a foreign country that has the written support of the national government of the foreign country; an international corporation that employs you in a role to which your course of study is of direct relevance; or a multilateral agency e.g. United Nations, World Bank or Asian Development Bank.</li> <li>Please note: If the funds are being provided by another person (for example your parents) you will need to provide a letter of authorization from them stating that you have access to these funds and a copy of the bio data (photo) page of their passport. If a business is providing the funds, you will need to provide business tax returns for the previous three years, profit and loss statements prepared by a registered accounting firm, bank statements, evidence of registration, Memorandum and Articles of Association to confirm ownership of the business, and a letter of authorization from all company directors giving permission for company funds to be used.</li> </ul>	
Source of funds You will need to provide evidence that your regular income, or the regular income of any individual providing funds to you, is sufficient to accumulate the level of funding being provided. This can include income tax declarations or regular pay slips.
