

VISA C - Transit Visa

This visa allows you only to transit in the international zone or in the zone under the authority of the customs at the airport. It does not allow you to leave the airport.

To avoid any disappointment, applicants are advised to submit their complete files at least 14 working days before the intended date of departure.

Required documents:

1. A valid travel document (passport) in which a visa can be affixed. This travel document must be valid for 15 months minimum. *Additionally, for non-Ugandans/non South Sudanese, a valid residence permit for Uganda valid for a minimum of 12 months .*
2. An online VOW visa application form correctly filled in and signed together with two recent color passport photos bearing a true likeness to the applicant. <https://visaonweb.diplomatie.be/>
3. Copy of the identity page of your passport
4. A valid entry visa/residence permit for the country of destination or a letter from the immigration service from that country granting entry upon arrival.
5. Documents relating to the continuation of the journey onwards to the final destination after the intended airport transit: i.e. Invitation letter, hotel booking and/or proof of the reason for traveling to the country of destination.
6. Proof of sufficient means of subsistence for the duration of the stay (e.g. traveller cheques and credit cards accepted, a pledge of financial support, an employment contract, current bank statements etc..)
7. Copy of private travel insurance of the visa applicant and covering a minimum of 30.000€ medical costs for a minimum period of 3 months. Please refer to the list of recognized local insurance companies via following link:

8. Letter of introduction from the applicant's employer, organisation, school or institution certifying granted holidays or the purpose of a business related trip.
9. Flight booking/reservation.

Remarks:

1. Submission of your old passport pointing to previous trips and Schengen visas can be useful.
2. Additional documents, even if not featured in the list above, may be required by the Embassy.
3. You should submit your application minimum 1 month before the foreseen travel date.
4. You can submit your application at the earliest three months before your planned visit.
5. The visa fee is non-refundable if the visa is denied.
6. A later change to the purpose of the visit is not admissible. A prolongation of the visa is not possible. In both cases, a new application has to be entered.
