Non-essential trips in and out of Belgium are prohibited from Wednesday 27 January to Monday 1 March 2021. Anyone travelling to or from Belgium will be required to carry a sworn statement. Download the form here. An online version of this form will be available later.

Only essential travel is allowed during this period, i.e. travel for:

- 1. Compelling family reasons
- 2. Humanitarian reasons
- 3. Study purposes
- 4. Residents of border areas
- 5. Professional reasons when performing work-related activities
- 6. Miscellaneous

Are you returning to Belgium after a stay abroad of more than 48 hours?

- Fill in the <u>Public Health Passenger Locator Form</u>in the **48 hours** before your arrival in Belgium.
- Based on your answers, the form will calculate whether you are at high risk of corona.
 - Did you receive a text message? You are at high risk from coronavirus. You
 must <u>quarantine</u>. Get <u>tested</u> on day 1 and day 7 of quarantine. You will receive a code by
 text message.
 - You did not receive a text message? You do not have to quarantine.
 - Did you complete the paper version of the Passenger Locator Form? You will be contacted by phone.
