- Please ensure you complete the current version of the application **Form 931 Application for an Australian Declar-atory visa**
- If you wish to authorize a person to communicate with the DIBP about your application and/or receive corre-spondence on your behalf, complete either **Form 956** or **Form 956A** (whichever form is applicable to your cir-cumstances — refer to section titled 'Who Should Use This Form') and submit this form with your visa application.
