



## Medical Treatment visa (subclass 602) Application document checklist

**Important:** Do not provide original documents unless requested. You should provide VFS witnessed or notarised copies of original documentation. Documents not in English must be accompanied by accredited English translations.

You should ensure that you lodge a completed visa application. While the department may ask you to provide more information in order to determine whether you meet the criteria for grant of the visa, a decision on the visa application may be made solely on the information provided at the time of application.

If you authorise another person to receive all communications about your application with the department, provide <a href="#">Form 956</a>	
Visa application charge There is no application charge for this visa if you apply from outside Australia or if you represent a foreign government	
<b>Personal documents</b>	✓
Notarised copy of all pages of current passport, including the bio data page, alterations page and back page of the passport (Please note, VFS Global can witness a copy of your passport at their office at the time of lodgement)	
Two recent passport-sized photographs (45 mm x 35 mm) of each person included in the application. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• These photographs should be of the head and shoulders only against a plain background.</li> <li>• Print the name of the person on the back of each photograph.</li> </ul>	

<b>Children younger than 18 years of age</b>	✓
<p>Children under 18 must provide a notarised 'no objection certificate' from any non-accompanying parent authorising their travel to Australia along with copies of the parents' passports.</p> <p><b>See:</b> <a href="#">Form 1229</a> - Consent to grant an Australian visa to a child under the age of 18 years.</p>	
<p>Where children are travelling or staying with non-relatives, provide the full name, nationality and the date of birth of the person the child will be staying or travelling with. A declaration of support signed by the person responsible for that child in Australia. <i>Form 1257 Undertaking declaration can be used for this.</i></p> <p><b>See:</b> <a href="#">Form 1257</a> Undertaking declaration</p>	
<b>Medical Documents</b>	✓
<p>If you are seeking treatment in Australia or donating an organ:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A letter from the treating doctor in Australia outlining your medical condition and the treatment that will be required, including an estimate of the timeframe and cost of this treatment.</li> <li>• Evidence you have enough money to support yourself and anyone who comes with you while you are in Australia. This should include letters from any Australians who will be supporting you during your stay.</li> <li>• A letter from the treating doctor or hospital saying they are satisfied with arrangements for payment.</li> <li>• If you are going to be treated in a public hospital, the letter about payment arrangements must: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ come from the financial officer or the administration department of the public hospital.</li> <li>○ confirm that no Australian will be disadvantaged in accessing medical services as a result of your treatment.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	
<b>Health and Character documents</b>	✓
<p>All applicants must meet character requirements.</p> <p><b>See:</b> <a href="#">Character and penal clearance requirements</a></p>
