IMMIGRATION DIRECTIVE NO. 02 OF 2019

ASYLUM SEEKERS APPLYING FOR SECTION 31(2) OF THE IMMIGRATION ACT, NO. 13 OF 2002: WAIVERS & EXEMPTIONS

In terms of the Court Order of the Constitutional Court, in the matter between Ahmed and Others v the Minister of Home Affairs and Another, case no. 273/2017, the Court made an order to the extent that Immigration Directive 21 of 2015, issued by the Director-General of the Department of Home Affairs on 23rd February 2016, imposes a blanket ban on asylum seekers from applying for visas without provision for an exemption application under section 31(2)(c) of the Immigration Act 13 of 2002, it is declared inconsistent with the Immigration Act 13 of 2002 and invalid.

Section 31(2) of The Immigration Act, No. 13 of 2002 makes provision that upon application, the Minister may under terms and conditions determined by him or her— for good cause, waive any prescribed requirement or form. The Court concluded that there is no reason why asylum seekers and persons similarly placed, may not apply for an exemption and request that the Minister waive the prescribed requirements.

This Immigration Directive replaces Immigration Directive No. 21 of 2015, and Circular No. 10 of 2008 effective from the date of signature below. Asylum Seekers should be allowed to apply for a waiver or exemption as per section 31(2) of The Immigration Act.
