



VISA FOR FAMILY REUNION FOR CHILDREN (below 18 years old) WITH A NON EU PARENT OR A FILIPINO PARENT WHO IS THE SPOUSE/PARTNER OF A NON EU CITIZEN (Visa D)

The complete file should be lodged in 3 sets: 1 original and 2 copies

Please arrange your documents according to this checklist

A. General requirements :

1. [Visa application form](#) duly completed and signed;
2. Passport with validity of at least 3 months longer than the validity period of the D visa (9 months);
3. Copy of the data page of the passport together with all pages having visas and stamps;
4. One (1) passport sized photo with white background and not older than 6 months;
5. Non-refundable visa application fee to be paid upon submission of visa application;

B. Supporting documents :

From the parents to be joined in Belgium

- ⇒ Proof of identity of the parent and of his/her Belgian spouse/partner (if any) (copy of both ID cards)
- ⇒ Proof of marriage or official cohabitation of the parent and Belgian spouse/partner (if any)
- ⇒ Family composition certificate issued by the municipality in Belgium
- ⇒ Proof of registered and sufficient lodging
- ⇒ Proof of certificate of Health Insurance ([click here for more information](#))
- ⇒ Proof of regular, stable and sufficient income covering one year prior to submission of the visa application (salary slips, last income tax assessment paper from the Finance Department in Belgium, etc.)

From the visa applicant

- ⇒ Birth Certificate issued on Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) Security Paper with DFA apostille
- ⇒ Proof of custody. If the name of both biological parents are mentioned in the birth certificate:

- applicant has to get an Affidavit of Consent from the parent living in the Philippines allowing him/her to live permanently with his/her parent in Belgium. This document must have a DFA apostille.

Visa for Belgium

- in the absence of an Affidavit of Consent, a court judgment giving sole custody to the parent in Belgium must be submitted. The court judgment must have a finality decree with DFA apostille.
- if the parent in the Philippines is deceased, death certificate issued on Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) Security Paper with DFA apostille

⇒ Proof of Civil Status

- Certificate of Non-Appearance in the National Indices of Marriage (CENOMAR) issued on Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) security paper with DFA apostille

⇒ Medical Certificate attesting that you are not carrying any of the diseases which might endanger public health, from one of the [Embassy's accredited clinics](#).
