

VISA FOR MARRIAGE (Visa D)

The complete file should be lodged in 3 sets: 1 original and 2 copies

Please arrange your documents according to this checklist

A. General requirements:

- 1. Visa application form duly completed and signed;
- 2. Passport with validity of at least 6 months;
- 3. Copy of the data page of the passport together with all pages having visas and stamps;
- 4. One (1) passport sized photo with white background and not older than 6 months;
- 5. Non-refundable visa application fee to be paid upon submission of visa application;
- 6. Proof of payment of the administrative fee, see: Fee | IBZ

Please note:

The applicant might have to proceed to the Embassy for an interview. The embassy will call the applicant to arrange for the interview.

B. Supporting documents:

Proof of Travel Medical Insurance

- ⇒ Copy of the travel and medical insurance policy issued to applicant by an accredited company
- ⇒ The insurance should mention:
 - o A minimum coverage of 30,000 Euros

 - Validity in all Schengen countriesCoverage period for at least 90 days

C. Documents to submit specifically for marriage purposes in Belgium

From the fiancé to be joined in Belgium

- ⇒ Copy of the Belgian ID-card or Belgian residence card for foreigners
- ⇒ Proof of civil status ("Burgerlijke staat / Etat civil") to be obtained from the future spouse's Belgian municipality
- ⇒ Marriage Declaration Act from Belgium ("akte van aangifte van huwelijk /acte de déclaration de mariage") issued by the municipality in Belgium

- ⇒ Proof of sufficient registered lodging: Adequate housing | IBZ
- ⇒ Proof of certificate of Health Insurance (click here for more information)
- Proof of recent sufficient income: 3-6 last months' salary slips OR for independent work: last income tax assessment paper from the Finance Department in Belgium (laatste aanslagbiljet van de belastingen/dernier extrait de rôle du Ministère des finances)

From the visa applicant

- ⇒ Birth Certificate issued on Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) Security Paper with DFA apostille
- ⇒ Proof of Civil Status before marriage
 - If single:
- Certificate of Non-Appearance in the National Indices of Marriage (CENOMAR) issued on Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) security paper with DFA apostille
- If formerly married and the marriage was held in the Philippines and has been annulled:
 - court judgment of annulment with finality decree, with DFA apostille
 - former marriage certificate with annotation of annulment, issued on Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) security paper with DFA apostille
- If formerly married and the marriage was held in the Philippines but divorced abroad:
 - recognition or validation of the divorce decree by the Philippine court with DFA apostille
 - former marriage certificate with annotation of annulment, issued on Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) Security Paper with DFA apostille
- If formerly married and the marriage was held abroad and divorced abroad:
 - divorce decree issued by the appropriate court in such country, properly legalized by the competent authorities
 - Advisory on Marriages issued on Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) security paper with DFA apostille
- If widow/widower:
 - death certificate of former husband issued on Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) Security Paper with DFA apostille
 - Advisory on Marriages issued on Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) Security Paper with DFA apostille
- ⇒ NBI Clearance (issued not less than 6 months prior to visa application) with DFA apostille
- ⇒ Medical Certificate attesting that you are not carrying any of the diseases which might endanger public health, from one of the Embassy's accredited clinics

From both partners

⇒ Proof of the permanent and stable character of the relationship

pictures, letters, mails, telephone bills, money transfers, copies of previous visas and immigration stamps in passports, hotel invoices, airline tickets, signed declarations of friends and relatives, proof of holidays together, etc.
