 <u>High qualified activity exercised by subordinate worker</u> A valid contract a work promise, for a minimum period of one year, and for a salary of 1,5 times de annual gross salary, or three times de indexed value for social welfare support (IAS); or For work related activities in the 1st and 2nd international category types (CITP) groups, as stipulated by the Council of Ministers, and following the opinion of the Permanent Commission for Social Harmonization (CPCS). For professional activities considered particularly in need for professionals from third countries, de minimum salary should (Article 1, a)) correspond to 1,2 times de annual gross salary, or two times de indexed value for social welfare support (IAS); Regulated highly qualified profession: proof that is enabled to exercise that profession in Portugal; un-regulated profession: proof that holds high professional qualifications, adequate for the referred field of work or sector stipulated in the work contract or the work promise.
