For this purpose, family members are: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The spouse,</li> <li>• Under aged children or incapable persons under care of the couple or of one spouse,</li> <li>• Minors adopted by the applicant when unmarried, by the applicant or spouse, as per decision of the competent authority of the country of origin, on condition that the country's laws attribute to the adopted children identical rights and duties akin to natural parenthood and that the decision be recognised in Portugal,</li> <li>• Adult sons, dependent on the couple or on one spouse, single and that study in a teaching establishment in Portugal,</li> <li>• Under aged sons, under the care of the couple, or of one spouse, that are single and study, as long as the holder of the right to family</li> </ul>	<input type="checkbox"/>	<input type="checkbox"/>

<b>ADDITIONAL DOCUMENTS FOR MINORS</b>		
<p>Minors who are not traveling with both parents or are traveling with a third person: must present a travel authorization, with a recognized signature, duly legalized, from the parent with whom they are not traveling or both, or a court decision (when applicable) authorizing the minor to travel and stay in Portugal during the foreseen period according to the reason for the stay.</p>	<input type="checkbox"/>	<input type="checkbox"/>

<p><b>CPLP citizens are exempted from presenting:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• travel insurance,</li> <li>• means of subsistence,</li> <li>• return transport ticket.</li> </ul> <p><b>upon presentation of a statement of responsibility in the following terms:</b></p> <p>k) Presentation of a term with a recognized signature issued by the host entity for interns or workers, as well as by the organization responsible for student exchange or volunteer programs; <b>or,</b></p> <p>l) Presentation of a term of responsibility, with a recognized signature, signed by a Portuguese citizen or a foreign citizen, with a residence permit in Portugal, which guarantees food and accommodation for the visa applicant, as well as the replacement of removal costs, in case of irregular stay.</p>	<input type="checkbox"/>	<input type="checkbox"/>
