Simplified procedure:

The third-state national who has been admitted for the purpose of seasonal work in national territory (NT), at least once in the last five years, and who has complied with the provisions of the law regarding entry and stay in Portugal, benefits from a simplified procedure when granting a new temporary stay visa for seasonal work, namely it is exempted from presenting the documents referred to in paragraphs c) to e) of nº1 of article 51ºA of Law 23/2007 of 4 of July (accommodation, proof of regulated profession and return ticket) and the request must be treated as a priority, and the decision period cannot exceed 15 days.

Notes:

- Failure to submit all the necessary documents may lead to the rejection of the visa application.
- The Consular Post reserves the right to request documents other than those mentioned above whenever deemed convenient.
- Even if all the requested documents are presented, it doesn't imply the automatic granting of the visa. Refusal of the visa application shall not entitle to a reimbursement of the visa fee.
