CPLP citizens are exempted from presenting: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • travel insurance, and, • means of subsistence. Upon presentation of statement of responsibility in the following terms: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a) Presentation of a term with a recognized signature issued by the host entity for interns or workers, as well as by the organization responsible for student exchange or volunteer programs; or, b) Presentation of a term of responsibility, with a recognized signature, signed by a Portuguese citizen or a foreign citizen, with a residence permit in Portugal, which guarantees food and accommodation for the visa applicant, as well as the replacement of removal costs, in case of irregular stay. 	<input type="checkbox"/>	<input type="checkbox"/>
