

TEMPORARY STAY VISA FOR PERIODS OF OVER 3 MONTHS IN EXCEPTIONAL AND WELL-FOUNDED CIRCUMSTANCES, NAMELY FOR PROGRAMS OF STUDY IN A CERTIFIED INSTITUITION, STUDENT EXCHANGE, UNPAID PROFESSIONAL INTERNSHIP, VOLUNTEER WORK, INTERNATIONAL COMMITMENTS RELATED TO THE FREE MOVEMENT OF SERVICES, HOLDERS OF VALID PORTUGUESE RESIDENCE PERMITS THAT HAVE BEEN LOST OR STOLEN, RETIREES OR PEOPLE LIVING OUT FROM INDIVIDUAL REVENUES WITH ESTABLISHED CONNECTION TO PORTUGAL, FAMILY MEMBERS OF PORTUGUESE NATIONALS (E6)

Criminal record certificate, issued within the past 3 months by the competent authority of the country of the applicant's nationality or of the country where the applicant has resided for over a year, with the Hague Apostille or legalised. Only the <u>ACRO</u> certificate, with the Hague Apostille, can be accepted as a UK Criminal Record Certificate. Return transport ticket (i.e. proof of applicant leaving Portugal at the end of their intended stay).		
 Proof of accommodation in Portugal for the duration of the stay: Deeds of property in Portugal in the name of the applicant; or Rental agreement of property in Portugal and proof of registration of rental agreement with the relevant tax authorities (AT); or Term of responsibility filled and signed by host/institution. When sponsored by a private citizen, the term of responsibility must also be accompanied with a copy of the host's passport/ID, Portuguese residence permit (if applicable), property deeds/rental agreement with the host's name, notarised authorization from the landlord and identification document of the landlord (if authorization is required for guests). The Term of Responsibility concerning the conditions of stay within Portuguese territory will only be accepted if the subscriber's signature is duly recognized by a Notary that serves the sponsor's legal area of residence; or Confirmed Hotel or homestay/Airbnb bookings for the duration of the stay and proof of payment (receipt/invoice). Other lengths and accommodation types may be considered for students and interns, including confirmed hotel or homestay/Airbnb bookings covering the miniterns, including confirmed hotel or homestay/Airbnb bookings covering the miniterns.

Proof of financial resources/means of subsistence (https://vistos.mne.gov.pt/en/national-visas/necessary-documentation/means-of-subsistence): • Last 3 months of bank statements, showing an available bank balance equal or superior to the Portuguese minimum monthly salary, multiplied by the number of months the applicant intends to stay in Portugal (up to 12 months); or • Term of responsibility filled and signed by sponsor/institution, which guarantees food and accommodation for the visa applicant, as well as the replacement of removal costs, in case of irregular stay. When sponsored by a private citizen, the term of responsibility must also be accompanied by a copy of the host's passport/ID, Portuguese residence permit (if applicable), last 3 months of bank statements and latest Income Tax Return (IRS) of the subscriber (if applicable). The Term of Responsibility concerning the conditions of stay within Portuguese territory will only be accepted if the subscriber's signature is duly recognized by a Notary that serves the sponsor's legal area of residence. To determine financial resources/means of subsistence, means obtained through work or service provider contract, grants or scholarships, can be taken into consideration, but applicants must still provide an available bank balance equal to at least one Portuguese minimum monthly salary.

For study purposes for less than a year in a certified institution, or in the framework of a student exchange program: Document issued by the institution and document certifying enrolment Statement signed by the host family or proof of housing	
For professional internship purposes: • Document issued by the company or professional training facility, officially recognized, certifying the admission to the internship, the respective program, and if necessary, the training contract and schedule of the program.	
For volunteer work purposes: • Document issued by the officially recognized institution in charge of the volunteer program, in Portugal, certifying admission to the program	
In the framework of international commitments related to the free movement of services: • Service agreement contract between the third-country national and the final consumer • Certificate of technical qualification for the delivery of the service in question	
 Passive income earners with established connection to Portugal: Document certifying retirement amount (pension letter, pension statements, tax return with pension information, etc.) or evidence of revenue from movable and immovable property; intellectual or financial assets (dividends, rents (property deeds and rental contracts), investment portfolio, etc.). All income should be readily available and verifiable through tax returns and/or accountant/fiscal entity statement, and/or bank transactions. Proof of exceptional circumstances, in particular, property ownership in Portugal (property deeds).

Holders of a valid Portuguese Residence Permit that has been lost or stolen: AIMA is responsible for the renewal and replacement of Portuguese Residence Permits. Applicants can apply for a National Visa if they do not reside in the UK and require a visa in order to travel to Portugal to renew/replace their Portuguese Residence Permit with AIMA: Original Portuguese Residence Permit (if lost, a copy or equivalent can be accepted) Proof of appointment with AIMA to renew the Portuguese Residence Permit (if applicable) Police Report in case of lost or stolen Portuguese Residence Permit Proof of address in Portugal (serves as proof of accommodation) 	

Holders of a valid Portuguese Residence Permit that has been lost or stolen are exempt from providing Criminal Record Certificate, Travel Insurance, Transport Document and Means of Subsistence.	
Family members of Portuguese nationals: Applicable to family members of Portuguese nationals that wish to stay in Portugal for more than 90 days, with the corresponding Portuguese national. Family member is defined as the following: A. the spouse; B. the partner with whom the Portuguese national has contracted a registered partnership, or has been cohabitating for over two years with relevant evidence (council tax and utility bills, bank statements, rental contracts, owned property, etc., and a No Trace of Marriage Document (apostilled and for both partners) that can be requested from the General Register Office: https://www.gov.uk/general-register-office) C. the direct descendants who are under the age of 21 or are dependants and those of the spouse or partner as defined in point (B); D. the dependent direct relatives in the ascending line and those of the spouse or partner as defined in point (B); E. Parents of Portuguese nationals under the age of 21 The following documents must be provided: Proof of kinship with Portuguese National - original or certified copy Passport or Citizen Card of Portuguese National - original or certified copy Proof of joint travel or, if joining a Portuguese family member that is already in Portugal, a signed declaration from the Portuguese national stating that they will be meeting inside Portugal Proof of joint accommodation (for the Portuguese national and the applicant), for a stay of more than 90 days Family members of Portuguese nationals can be exempt from providing Criminal Record Certificate, Travel Insurance, Transport Document and Means of Subsistence. Family members of Portuguese nationals that wish to reside in Portugal should apply, directly in Portugal with AIMA, for the RESIDENCE CARD FOR A THIRD COUNTRY NATIONAL WHO IS A FAMILY MEMBER OF AN EU/EEA/SWITZERLAND CITIZEN. Youth Mobility: Citizens of Argentina, Australia, Canada, Chile, Japan, New Zealand, Peru, Republic of Korea and United States of America who wish to remain in Portugal, on holidays, for a maximum period of 12 months, under a Memorandum of Understanding signed between their country and Portugal, may be eligible for the Youth Mobility visa. ADITIONAL DOCUMENTS FOR MINORS	
 Unabridged birth certificate showing biological parents names; if the birth certificate is not in English or Portuguese, then a translation by a certified translator is also required. Original passports of both parents or certified copy of the biodata page of the passports. 	

Letter of consent of parental authority or legal guardian		
In the case of sole custody, the following documents must be submitted: • birth certificate mentioning one parent in English or Portuguese; or • death certificate of absent parent in English or Portuguese; or • court ruling in English or Portuguese.		
Application forms should be signed by the parent holding parental responsibility or legal guardian. When minors are not travelling with both parents, or are travelling with a third person, a travel authorization, with legalized signature, of one or both parents respectively, or a court order, is required.		
CPLP MOBILITY AGREEMENT		
CPLP citizens (from Brazil, Angola, Mozambique, Cape Verde, Guinea-Bissau, São Tomé and Príncipe, East Timor and Equatorial Guinea), are exempted from presenting: • travel insurance, • return transport ticket, • specific documents CPLP citizens are also exempt from presenting evidence of means of subsistence upon presentation of a term of responsibility recognised by a notary, in the following terms: a) Presentation of a term signed by the host entity for interns or workers, or by the organization responsible for student exchange or volunteer programs, or b) Presentation of a term of responsibility, signed by a Portuguese citizen or a foreign citizen, with a residence permit in Portugal, which guarantees food and accommodation for the visa applicant, as well as the replacement of removal costs, in case of irregular stay, accompanied by a copy of the sponsor's passport/ID., residence permit (if applicable), last 3 months of bank statements and most recent IRS declaration (if applicable).		
 A Temporary Stay Visa is used for stays of over 90 days and up to 1 year, wit into Portugal. A Temporary Stay visa application can take 30 days for a decision, but an 	extended pe	riod of analysis

- All work contracts or promissory work contracts should be duly registered with the relevant authorities and include: the identification, signatures and domicile of both parties; worker's activity and corresponding remuneration, place and normal working period; work start date and end date (if applicable); mention of vacation days and food allowance (if applicable); Christmas and holiday allowance (if appli-
- All public documents must be legalized per conventions in place, including, but not limited to, Civil Registry documentation, such as marriage and birth certificates, Criminal Record Certificates, professional certificates and diplomas. This legalization can be made through the Apostille (if applicable) or by utilizing the relevant Portuguese Consulate/service that serves the place of origin of the document in question: https://portaldascomunidades.mne.gov.pt/pt/rede-consular. Public documents from the United Kingdom, including the Criminal Record Certificate (ACRO) and Civil Registry documentation, must be legalized through the Apostille, which can be obtained from the Legalization Office: https://www.gov.uk/get-document-legalised. Certified translations are also required for documents not written in English or Portuguese.

•	The Term of Responsibility concerning the conditions of stay within Portuguese territory will only be accepted if the subscriber's signature is duly recognized by a Notary that serves the sponsor's legal area of residence.
•	Failure to submit all the necessary documents may lead to the rejection of the visa application.
•	The Consular Post reserves the right to request documents other than those mentioned above whenever deemed convenient.
•	Even if all the requested documents are presented, it doesn't imply the automatic granting of the visa.
•	Refusal of the visa application shall not entitle to a reimbursement of the visa fee.
