#### INTRODUCTION

A Schengen visa is a short-stay visa, valid for a maximum of <u>ninety (90) days during any hundred and eighty (180)</u> day period inside the Schengen area, and can be granted for tourism, family visit, business, seasonal work, transit, family members of Portuguese/EU/EEA/Swiss, family members of UK citizens residing in Portugal under the Withdrawal Agreement, among others.

Applications should be made at the country of legal residency of the applicant. The requirements for being the competent Member State to examine and decide on a uniform short-stay visa are:

- The Member State whose territory is the sole destination of the visit;
- If the visit includes more than one destination, or if several separate visits are to be carried out within a period of two months, the Member State whose territory constitutes the main destination of the visit(s) in terms of the length of stay, counted in days, or the purpose of stay; or
- If the main destination cannot be determined, the Member State through which external border the applicant intends to enter first.

The number of entrances and validity of a Schengen visa is the sole discretion of the Member-State responsible for the application, and is based on the documents provided, validity of the applicant's documents (passport and UK residence) and previous Schengen visas obtained and correctly used.

A Schengen visa (including Schengen business visa) can be used to travel anywhere inside the Schengen area during its validity (please check the visa carefully in terms of area, number of entrances, and dates). If a visa is not used as originally intended, more information can be requested by the border control agency and/or Schengen authority.

An applicant's right to enter the Schengen area is assessed by flight operators and border control. If you have any doubts, please contact the airline that will operate the flight, and/or the relevant border control agency (AIMA for Portugal).

#### Notes:

- Failure to submit all the necessary documents may lead to the rejection of the visa application.
- The Consular Post reserves the right to request documents other than those mentioned above whenever deemed convenient.
- Even if all the requested documents are presented, it doesn't imply the automatic granting of the visa. Refusal of the visa application shall not entitle to a reimbursement of the visa fee.

Applicants can appeal refusal to grant a visa, in compliance with Portuguese domestic law.

#### Available options being:

- Issue a complaint, within 15 days following acknowledgment of refusal, against the issuer of the refusal (in compliance with article 191, Administrative Process Code (CPA));
- Appeal the decision of refusal, within three months following notification, (in compliance with article 59
   Administrative Court Process Code, CPTA and paragraph 2 of artigo 193 CPA), to the Minister of Foreign
   Affairs email din@mne.pt
- Bring an action to competent court (Administrative Court, Lisbon, Article 22 by suppletion, CPTA), within three months of notification of refusal (Articles 69 and 59 Administrative Court Process Code, CPTA) requesting the overruling of the refusal, and the granting of the required lawful act.

The referred options are not mutually exclusive. As such, the applicant can appeal to the Minister and, depending on the results of such appeal, continue towards litigation (Paragraph 4, Article 59, CPTA).

The applicant can also appeal the decision and bring an action simultaneously to the administrative court, without waiting for the results of the appeal (in compliance with paragraph 5 of article 59 CPTA).

#### **Appointment with AIMA:**

 Customers that require a Visa to travel to Portugal with the intention of attending an appointment with AIMA, in complement with the standard documentation for a Schengen Visa application, must also provide proof of appointment with AIMA.

Official delegations travelling on the basis of an official invitation addressed to the government of the third country concerned, to participate in meetings, consultations, negotiations or exchange programmes, as well as in events held in the territory of a Member State by intergovernmental organisations:

- Letter issued by an authority of the third country concerned, confirming that the applicant is a member of the official delegation travelling to a Member State to participate in the abovementioned events, accompanied by a copy of the official invitation from the intergovernmental organisation in the Member State; or
- Verbal note from the relevant Embassy/institution.
