

- Temporary work visas allow bearers to engage in a paid professional activity, in Portugal, from 1 month to up to 3 years, either under contract to an employer or for self-employment.
- Applications are processed at Consulate and forwarded to the Portuguese Immigration authorities for consideration. A final answer may be received within 1 or 2 months. If application is approved, a visa will be issued by the Consulate.
- Accompanying family members who are nationals of countries that require Schengen visas must apply for a short stay visa and adjust their status with Portuguese Immigration authorities (SEF) once in Portugal. Short stay visas do not allow holders to engage in paid activities in Portugal.

Accompanying family members who are nationals of countries that **do not** require Schengen visas must enter the country using their passport (without a visa) and adjust their status with Portuguese Immigration authorities (SEF) once in Portugal

6	<b>Confirmed Accommodation:</b> from the inviting institution or confirmed hotel reservations, stating name, address and telephone number of the hotel, including confirmation number.		
7	<b>Proof of financial support;</b> Last 3 months of bank statements (electronic print outs are accepted);		
8	<b>FBI Criminal Record Certificate</b> (for applicants older than 15). <b>This document must be requested with an apostille or remain unopened in original sealed envelope.</b>		
9	<b>Permission to the Department of Borders and Customs to obtain criminal record from Portugal</b>		
10	<b>Copy of marriage certificate and children's birth certificate</b> (in case of a family).		
11	<b>Proof of Health Insurance</b> that covers medical expenses in Portugal through the duration of stay (insurance must not exclude COM D19)
